

Eligibility Criteria: Free Broadband for Community Hubs

- 1. Community Access: The facility must be used by the community, serving as a hub for local activities or services.
- 2. Free Community Use: The hub must provide free access to the community for activities, meetings, and events.
- 3. Public Service: The hub must offer public services or activities that benefit the community, such as educational programs, social events, health and wellness activities, and more.
- 4. Open to All: The facility must be open and accessible to all members of the community without discrimination.
- 5. Regular Use: The hub should demonstrate regular use by the community with a schedule of events and activities.
- 6. Commitment to Maintenance: The hub must commit to maintaining the broadband equipment and ensuring it is used appropriately.
- 7. Non-Commercial Use: The broadband service must be used for non-commercial purposes only.
- 8. Safe Environment: The hub must provide a safe and secure environment for all users.
- 9. Approval from Governing Body: The application for free broadband must be approved by the governing body or management committee of the hub.
- 10. Must be in a passed property. E.g. The prememises must be in an area that is serviceable by Truespeed.
